<u>02.386.017:</u> Consideration of raise in admission from 60 to 100 from 2022-2023 academic session in B.Pharm course at East Point College of Pharmacy, Bangalore, Karnataka.

17.1 It was directly taken up by the EC.

- 17.2 The matter was placed in 382 EC (17th November, 2022), which decided as under -
 - Regarding institution's request for consideration of raise in admission from 60 to 100, it was noted that
 - a) institution did not apply during 2021-2022 academic session.

- b) during 2022-2023, 371 EC (8.8.2022) under Item No.188 did not grant raise in intake in academic session 2022-2023 for B.Pharm course as the institution has failed to
 - appoint faculty, failed to maintain faculty cadre ratio and disburse salary as per statutory provisions of –
 - Minimum Qualification for Teachers in Pharmacy Institutions Regulations, 2014.
 - The Bachelor of Pharmacy (B.Pharm) Course Regulations, 2014.
 - ii) submit consent of examining authority for raise in admissions.
- c) The institution has still not submitted consent of affiliation of Examining Authority for raise in admission.
- In view of above, it was decided to reject the representation of the institution for raise in admission from 60 to 100 in B.Pharm course for 2022-2023 academic session.
- 17.3 Again matter was placed in 383 EC (24.11.2022), which decided as under -
 - It was noted that
 - a) with regard to institution's request for raise in admission from 2022-2023 academic session, institution has failed to submit the consent of affiliation of the Examining Authority and hence its request was rejected.
 - b) as per Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka's letter dt.1.6.2022 the matter regarding excess admissions made in B.Pharm course during 2021-2022 is sub-judice in the Hon'ble Karnataka High Court vide W.P. No.9802/2022 (EDN-RES).

17.4 The EC noted that -

- a) institution vide mail dt.1.12.2022 has submitted English version of State Government order No.Aukka 179, PTD 2020, Bangalore, dated: 29.11.2021 for increase intake from 60 to 100 from 2021-2022 academic session which is subject to approval from PCI.
- b) Council's advocate also opined to grant approval for raise in admission from 60 to 100.
- 17.5 In view of above, it was decided
 - a) to permit raise in admission from 60 to 100 from 2022-2023 academic session.
 - b) regarding 2021-2022 academic session, it was decided to instruct the institution to submit duly authenticated certificates as certified by the Examining Authority of passed out B.Pharm students admitted during 2021-2022 academic session.
- 17.6 It was further decided to take action in anticipation of comments from the EC members on the EC minutes.
